Grade Point Average

The weighted GPA system ranks the senior class for college purposes. Weighted grade points are awarded for all courses taken with the exception of courses taken for high school credit in intermediate school.

Class Rank

Class rank is based on the final grades of each semester and carry through all four grade levels.

Dual Credit

These courses are taken at the college level and count as both high school and transferable college courses.

Accreditation

Pasadena Memorial is fully accredited by the Texas Education Agency.

Curriculum

Pasadena Memorial offers a number of programs designed to meet each student's needs. College-prep courses are offered through our Advanced Placement Program. Our Special Education Program is designed for students who show need for special services and/ or a modified curriculum. English as a second Language is also offered. In addition, our Career and Technical Education department offers access to a variety of career, technical and educational pathways including articulated credit classes and classes which lead directly to careers.

Graduation Requirements

- The Foundation High School Program requires successful completion on 22 state-approved credits. Access to this program requires written permission from the counselor and parent only after the completion of the 10th grade year.
- The Foundation High School Program Plus Endorsement requires successful completion of 26 stateapproved credits.
- The Distinguished Level of Achievement includes successfully completing the curriculum requirements for the Foundation High School Program and the curriculum requirements for • at least one endorsement, including four credits in science and four credits in mathematics, to include Algebra II.
