South Houston (HS) — The annual PSAT test was given to the high school sophomores and juniors who were interested in college . . . the number of survivors was unknown.


The day was October 18 and it dawned bright and sunny. Early that morning, hundreds of students poured into the school's cafeteria. "I hate waking up early," voiced several students.

During February, the junior class voted Pat Ahlgrimm and Paula Perez as their class favorites.


Pat was involved in football, track, F.C.A., N.H.S. and the Spanish Club.




## C o u n c i l C o u n c i l s
