The Good Sportsmanship League is one of their top projects. The Council strives to represent the school body democratically in all subjects and discussions.

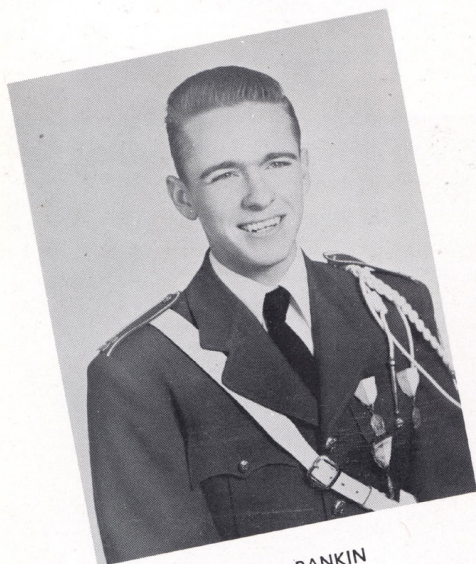

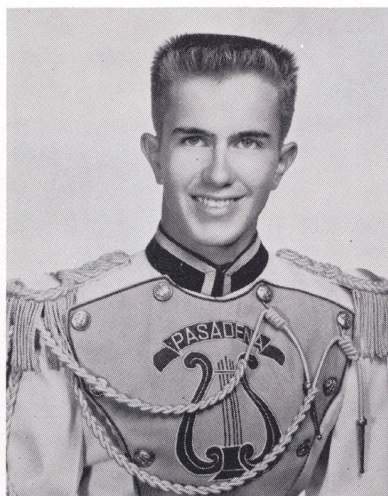

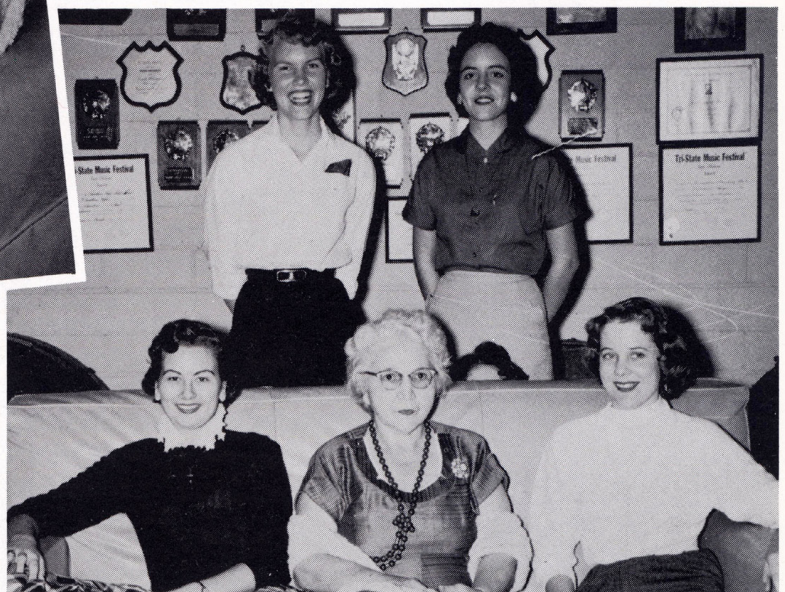


EAGLETTES

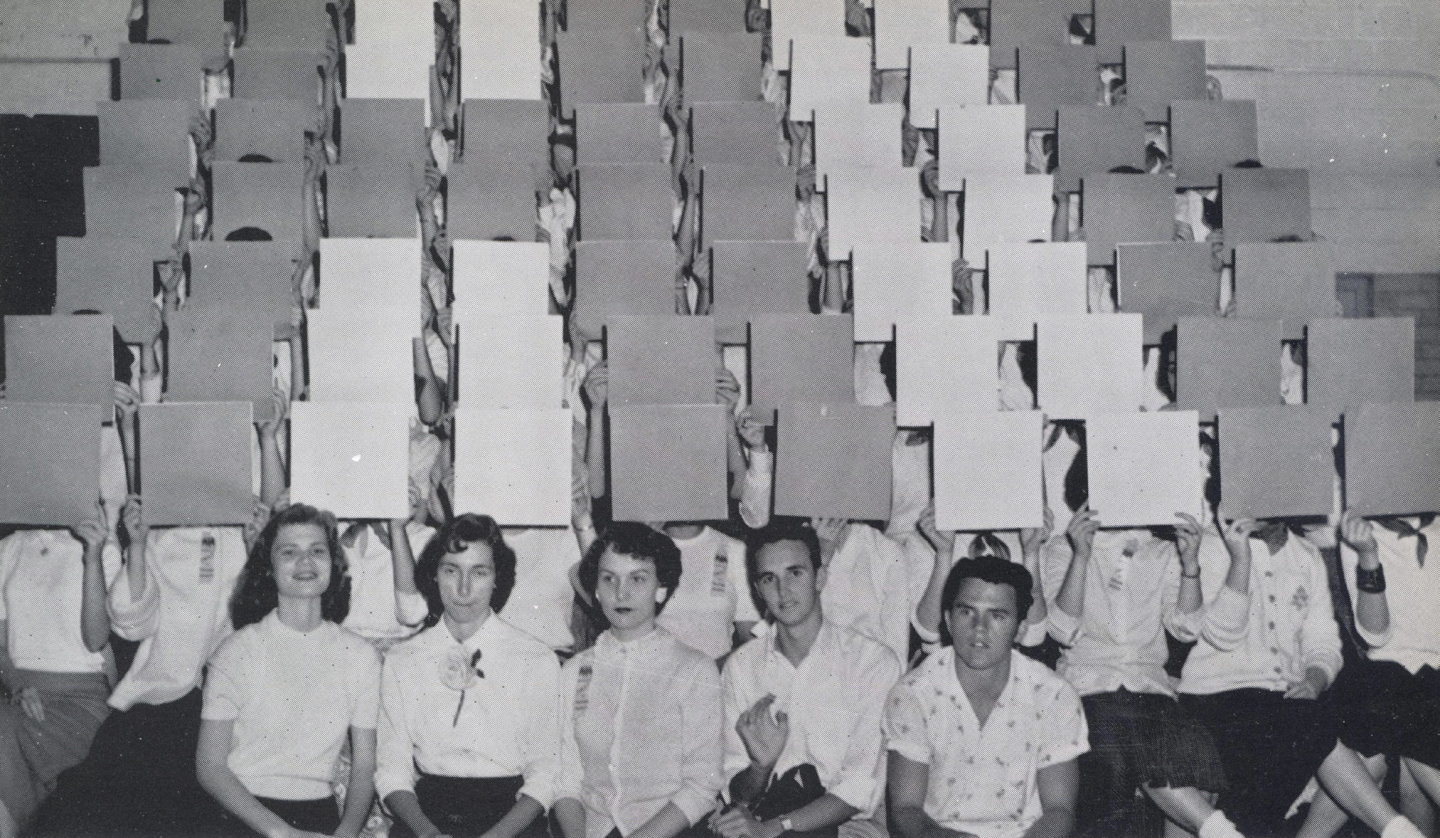
THE BOOSTER CLUB

Some of the activities sponsored by the Booster Club this year included a dance and a talent show.

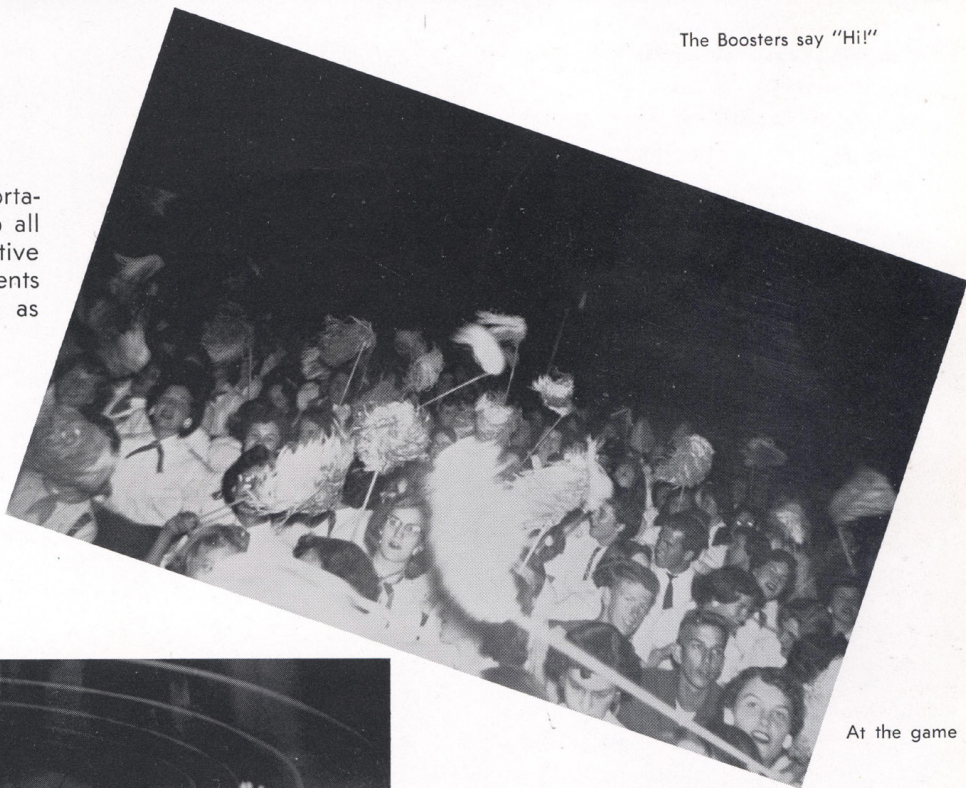

The girls in F.H.A. learn the essentials of homemaking and bettering their lives today so that they will be prepared for the future.

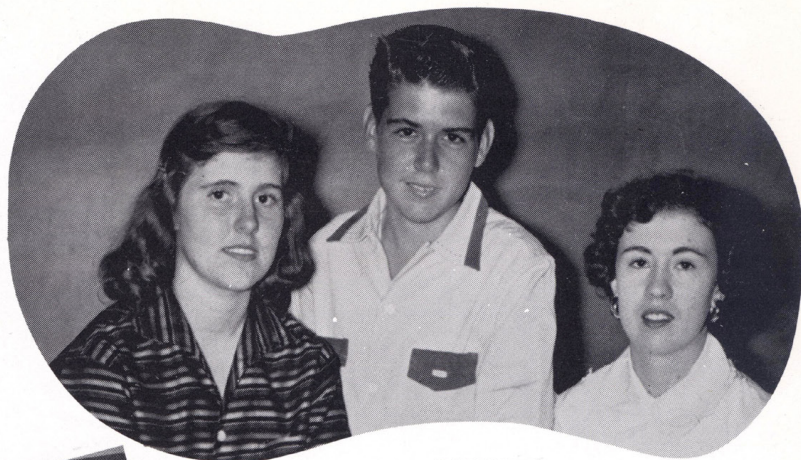

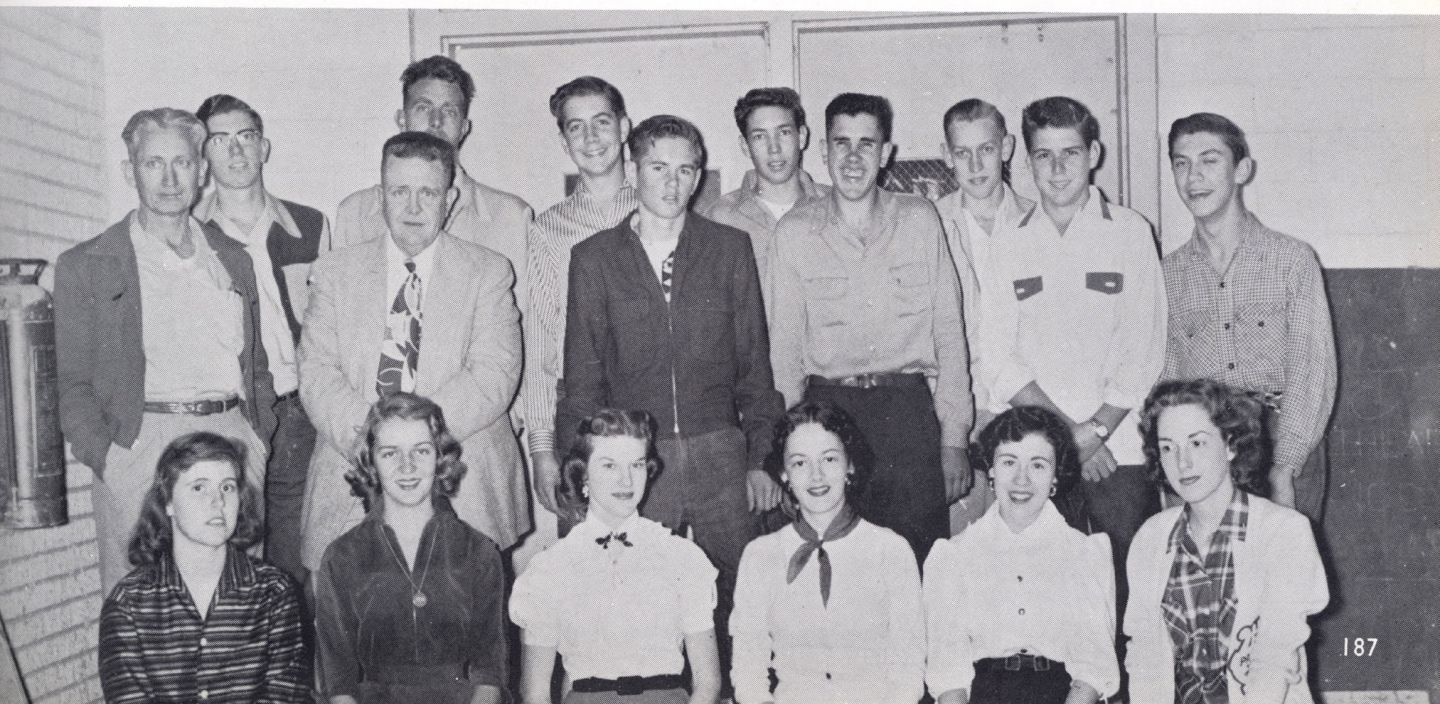

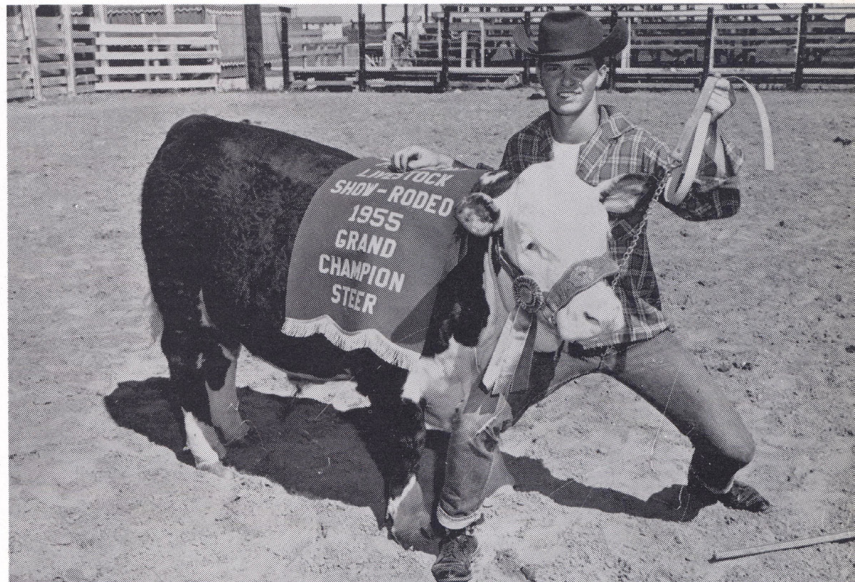
The foundation upon which the Future Farmers of America organization is built includes leadership and character development, sportsmanship, cooperation, service, thrift, and scholarship.

The Pasadena Chapter of F.F.A. is considered one of the outstanding chapters in the state. In the last three years we have had three state contest winners.

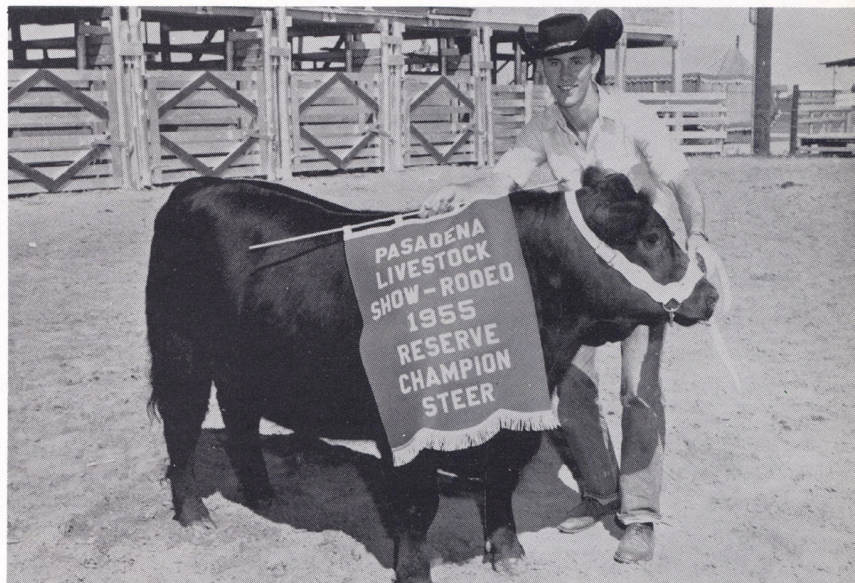

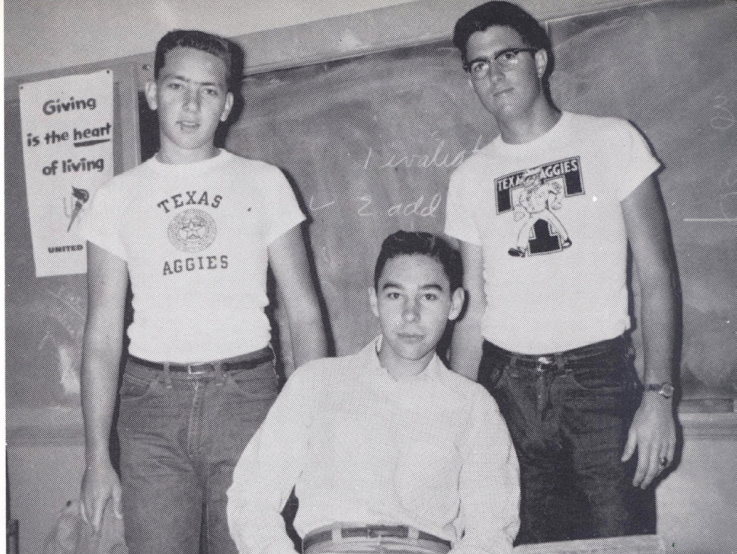

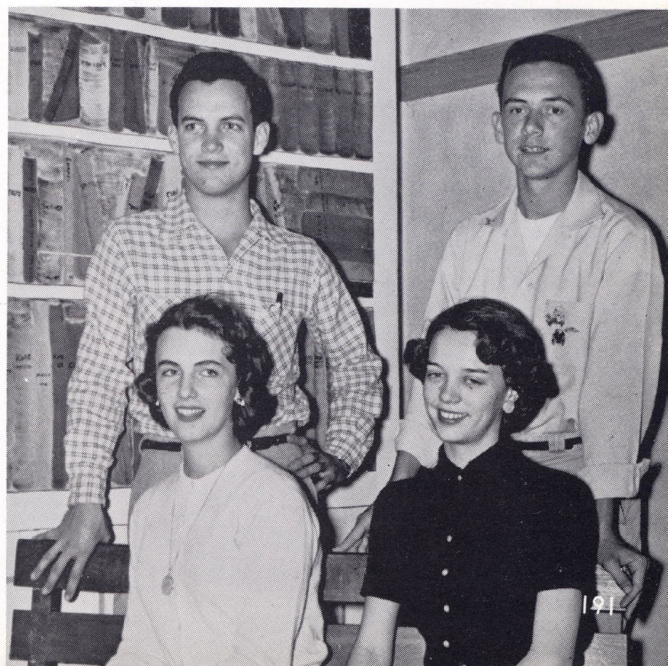


THE CURTAIN CLUB

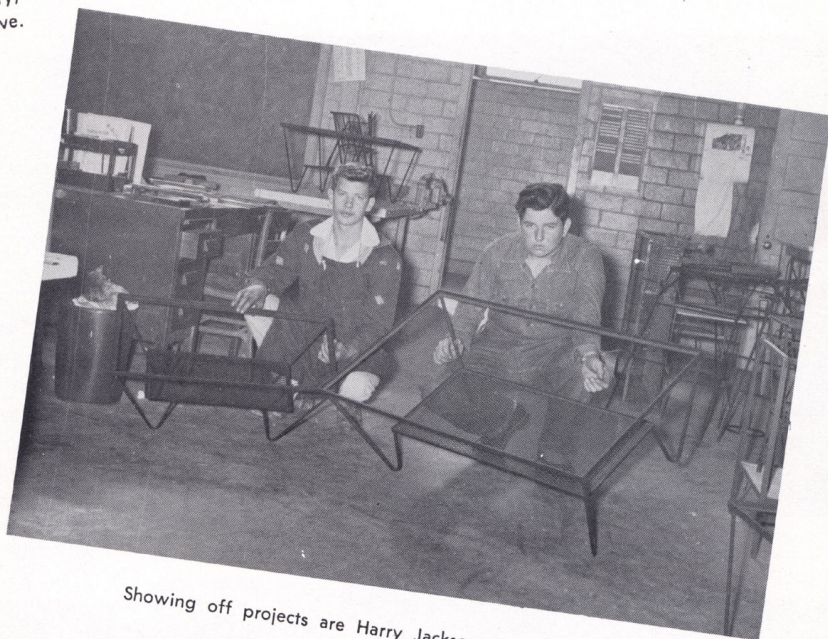

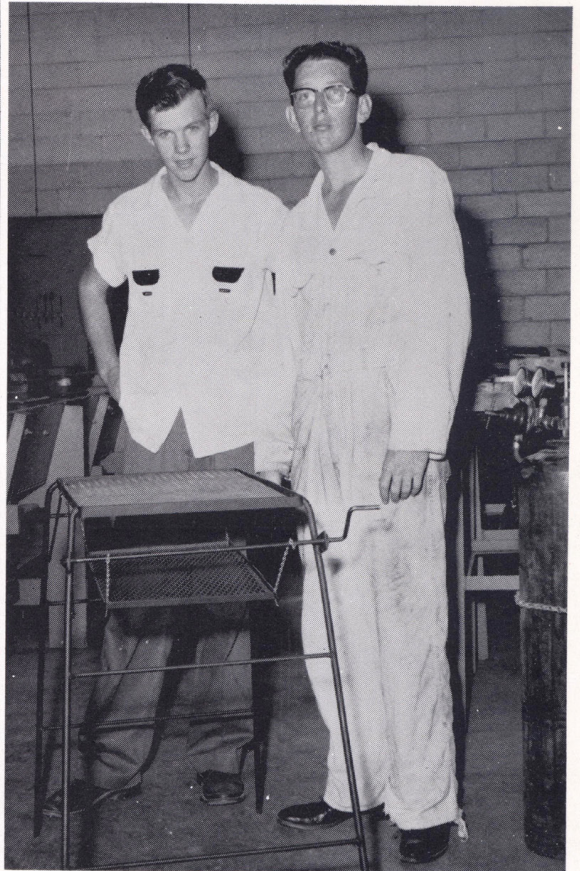
